## St Bartholomew's Burnley & St Stephen's Richmond

The Reverend Dr Wendy Crouch shares with us that; over the last six months a Young Adults group (YARA - Young Adults Richmond Anglicans) has been forming in the two Richmond parishes of St Bartholomew's and St Stephen's. Initially some started to come to the 5pm Sunday night Emmaus Eucharist. This then developed into a once a month pub meal after the service. There are now 8- 9 in the 20-30 age group who attend regularly. They have a variety of faith backgrounds. For the last 6 weeks they have been watching then discussing the movie "The Shack" with the aid of a study guide. The film was suggested by one of the group who was very keen to initiate and facilitate - with Rev'd Wendy as the support person. It has been a wonderful challenge for Rev'd Wendy to explore with them some deep theological issues that come up in relation to their probing questions. Having started meeting at the beginning of Lent in one of their homes, they needed to continue with Zoom for the last two weeks of the course. They will resume another film and study course after Easter. In addition to the Zoom meetings they have started a YARA WhatsApp group and Facebook page. Many delightful, humorous, poetic and crazy things are posted. These keep the group connected with each other at a time that can be particularly difficult for younger adults who have had their usually busy social and work lifestyles curtailed.
