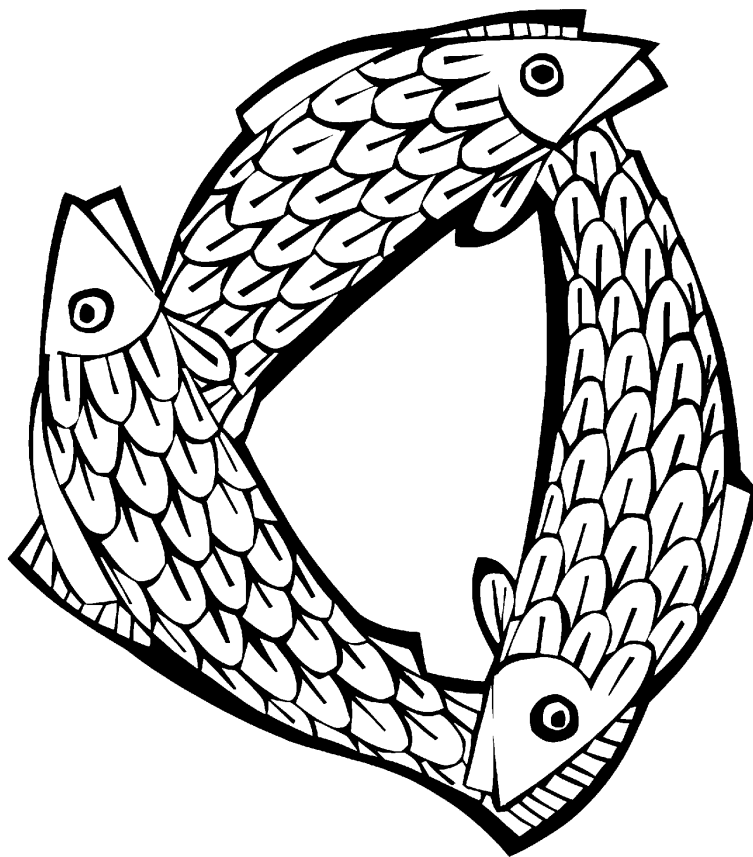

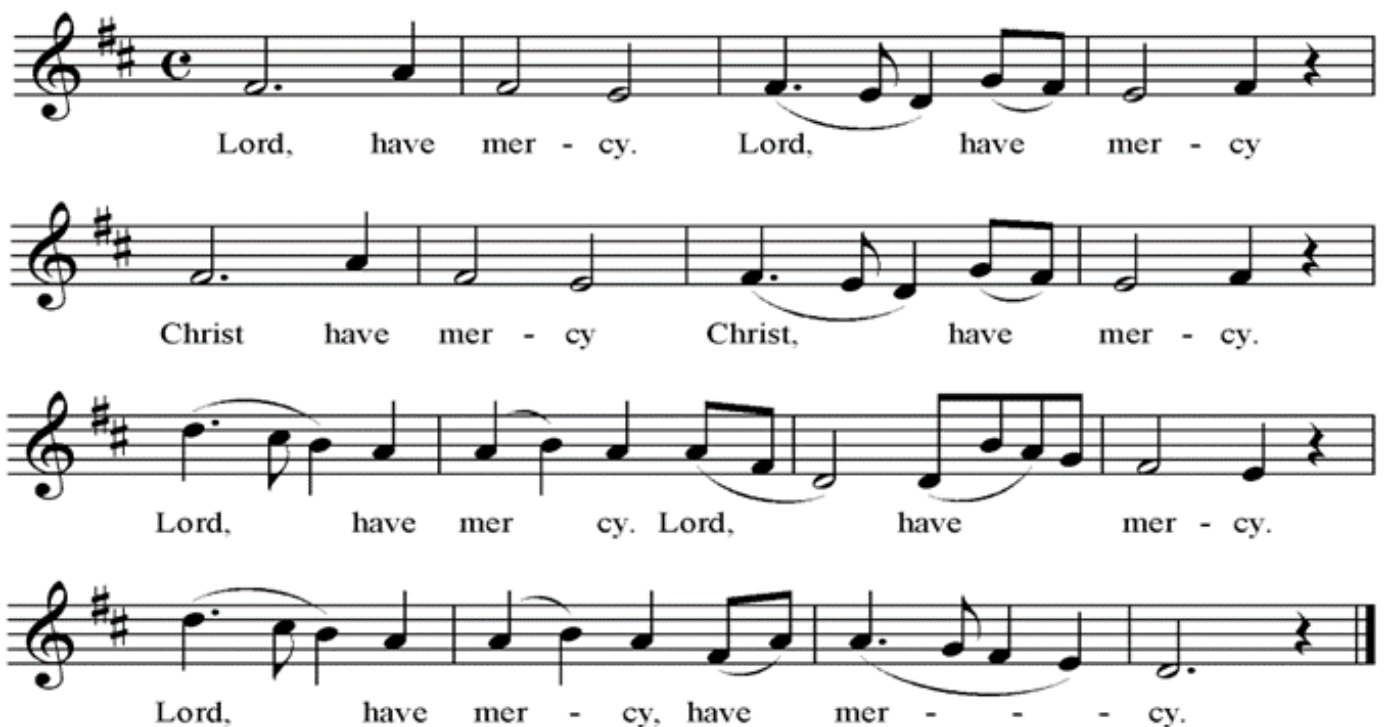

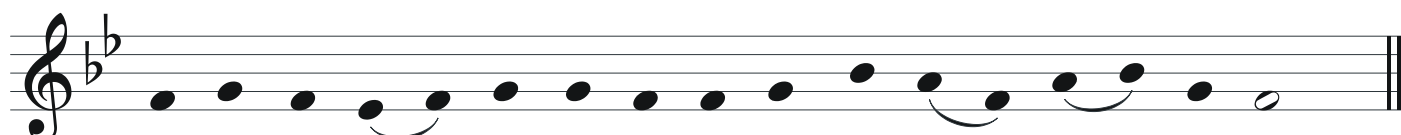

A reading from Paul's letter to the Romans:

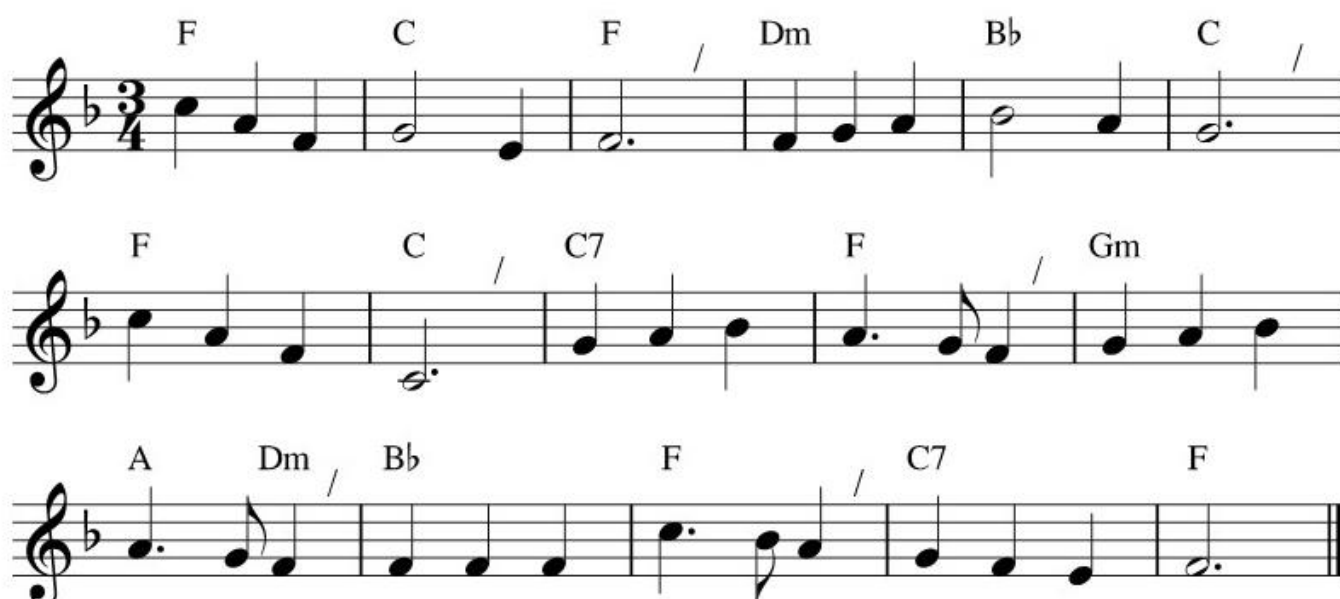
