
## Welcome to St Mary's North Melbourne. Thank you for joining us in worship.

#### Introduction

The old adage remains true: you can't take it with you.



his children shall come trembling from the west.



#### SECOND READING

A reading from Paul's letter to the Colossians:



**SERMON** 

NICENE CREED







Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.'


Let us proclaim the mystery of faith:




