SECOND READING

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews:

You have not come to something that can be touched, a blazing fire, and darkness, and gloom, and a tempest, and the sound of a trumpet, and a voice whose words made the hearers beg that not another word be spoken to them. (For they could not endure the order that was given, 'If even an animal touches the mountain, it shall be stoned to death.' Indeed, so terrifying was the sight that Moses said, 'I tremble with fear.') But you have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel. See that you do not refuse the one who is speaking; for if they did not escape when they refused the one who warned them on earth, how much less will we escape if we reject the one who warns from heaven! At that time his voice shook the earth; but now he has promised, 'Yet once more I will shake not only the earth but also the heaven.' This phrase 'Yet once more' indicates the removal of what is shaken—that is, created things—so that what cannot be shaken may remain. Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us give thanks, by which we offer to God an acceptable worship with reverence and awe; for indeed our God is a consuming fire. THE GOSPEL

A reading from the Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St Luke.

SERMON

NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. Victorian Anglicans Together

Victorian Anglicans Together (VAT) provides a forum for Anglicans from a broad spectrum of beliefs to meet together in unity and diversity. We work for renewal of the Church and its institutional structures to bring about God's just realm in responding to contemporary demands.

In light of the newly formed GAFCON 'Diocese of the Southern Cross' (DSC), VAT understands that:

1. DSC is not a diocese of the Anglican Church of Australia (ACA), but an Australian Public Company – Diocese of the Southern Cross Limited – whose directors are David Baker, Glenn Davies, and Susan Willis.

2. DSC would most likely appeal to clergy, parishes, and individuals in dioceses which it considers 'liberal'.

3. A clerk in holy orders must revoke their ACA licence to join DSC; it is unclear as to how Glenn Davies could issue a licence with any authority.4. There is no vehicle for a parish to join DSC and remain within its geographical and administering diocese.

5. Alternative episcopal oversight has proven to be problematic for individuals as well as worshipping communities.

6. ACA bishops have repeatedly said that parishes/AACs that wish to leave the Anglican Church of Australia will do so without any recourse to assets belonging to the Church.

VAT is committed to communion with the Archbishop of Canterbury.

VAT is sad to see the Church split in this way.

VAT wants to include people with a range of views.

VAT will continue to work for the diversity and to support the growth of the ACA and its ministries.

A statement on the launch of the company, the Diocese of The Southern Cross by Archbishop Geoff Smith in his capacity as Primate of the Anglican Church of Australia.

I note the formal launch this week of a company named the Diocese of the Southern Cross. This company, while established by some members of the Anglican Church of Australia and structured to mirror some of the characteristics of an Anglican diocese, has no formal or informal relationship or connection with the Anglican Church of Australia. As such it will operate independently from the Anglican Church as, effectively, a new denomination.

It is unfortunate that confusion may well result from the establishment of this organization among existing members of the Anglican Church of Australia and among people wishing to connect with the Anglican Church of Australia.

The meeting of the General Synod held in May this year clearly affirmed the view that marriage is between a man and a woman, and declined to affirm same sex marriage. It is perplexing therefore that the leaders of this breakaway movement cite the reason for this new denomination as the failure of General Synod to explicitly express an opinion against the blessing of same sex marriages.

It is always easier to gather with those we agree with. But in a tragically divided world God's call and therefore the church's role includes showing how to live together with difference. Not merely showing tolerance but receiving the other as a gift from God.

My conviction is that the Anglican Church of Australia can find a way to stay together, graciously reflecting God's great love, with our differences held sincerely. This week's announcement makes achieving that end more difficult but not impossible. I will continue to pray and work that God's call on the church will be realised and encourage others to do the same.
