INTRODUCTION

Habakkuk is one of the Minor Prophets writing in the late 7th century BCE. He may have been associated with the Temple in Jerusalem. In his dialogue with God he calls out for hearing and God assures him that 'the righteous live by their faith.' The reading from 2 Thessalonians focuses on thanksgiving and prayers for the community. And the Gospel is an example of a sinner (someone outside the Law) who welcomes Jesus into his home and whose life is transformed.

SERMON

NICENE CREED
