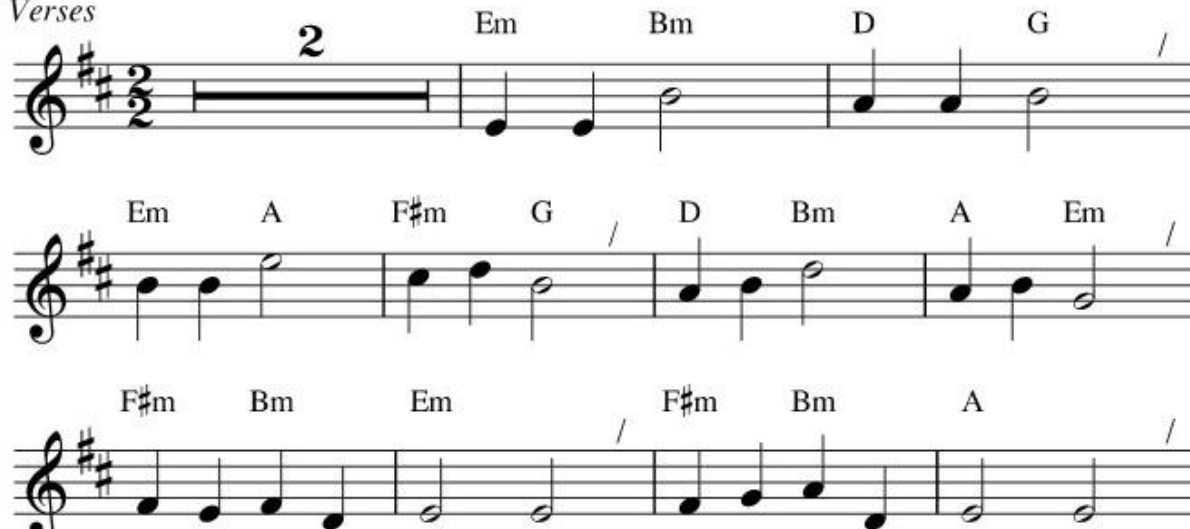
## INTRODUCTION

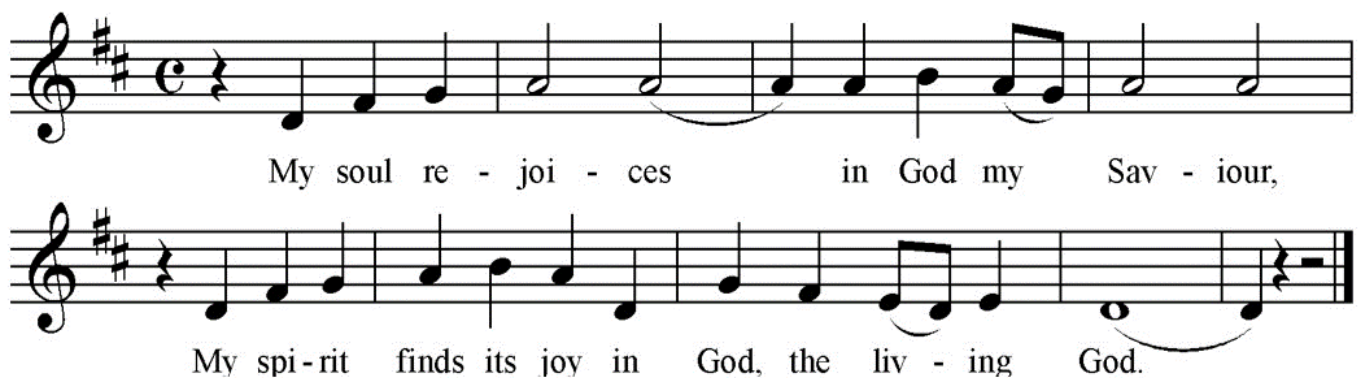

SERMON

NICENE CREED

**We believe in one God, the Father, the almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. 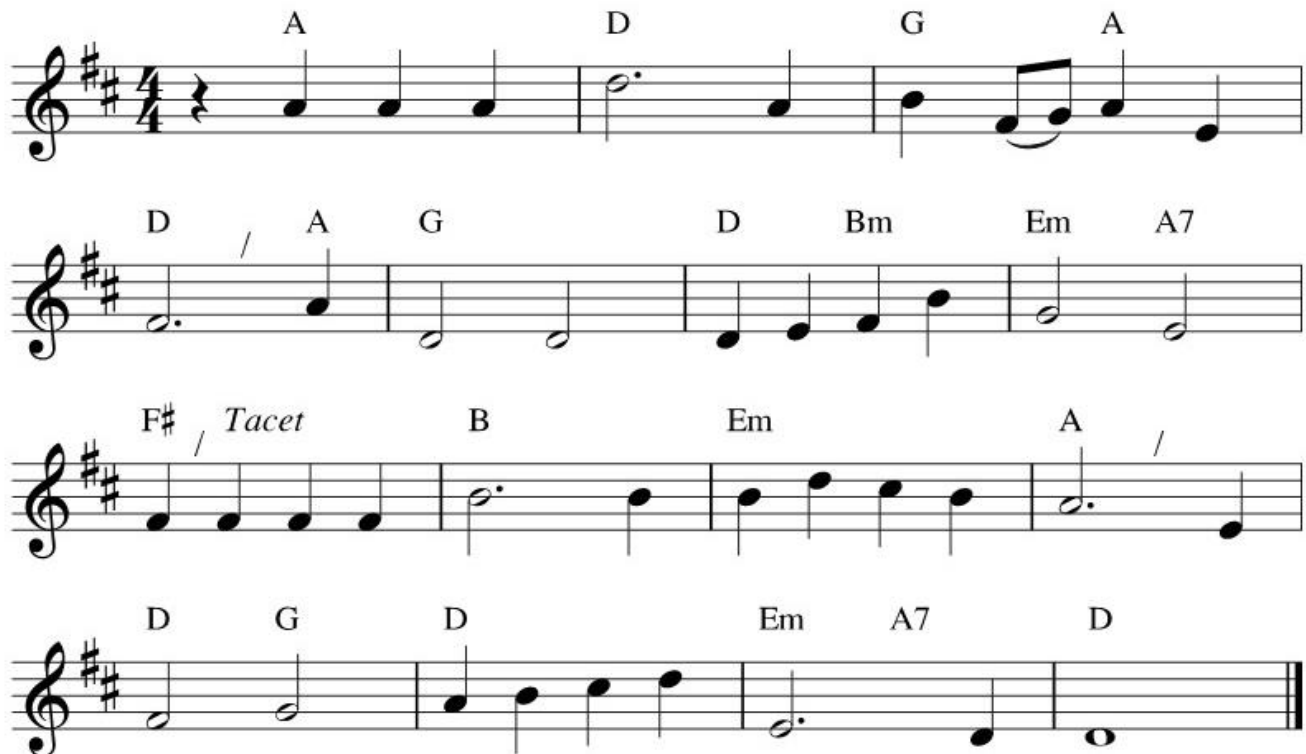

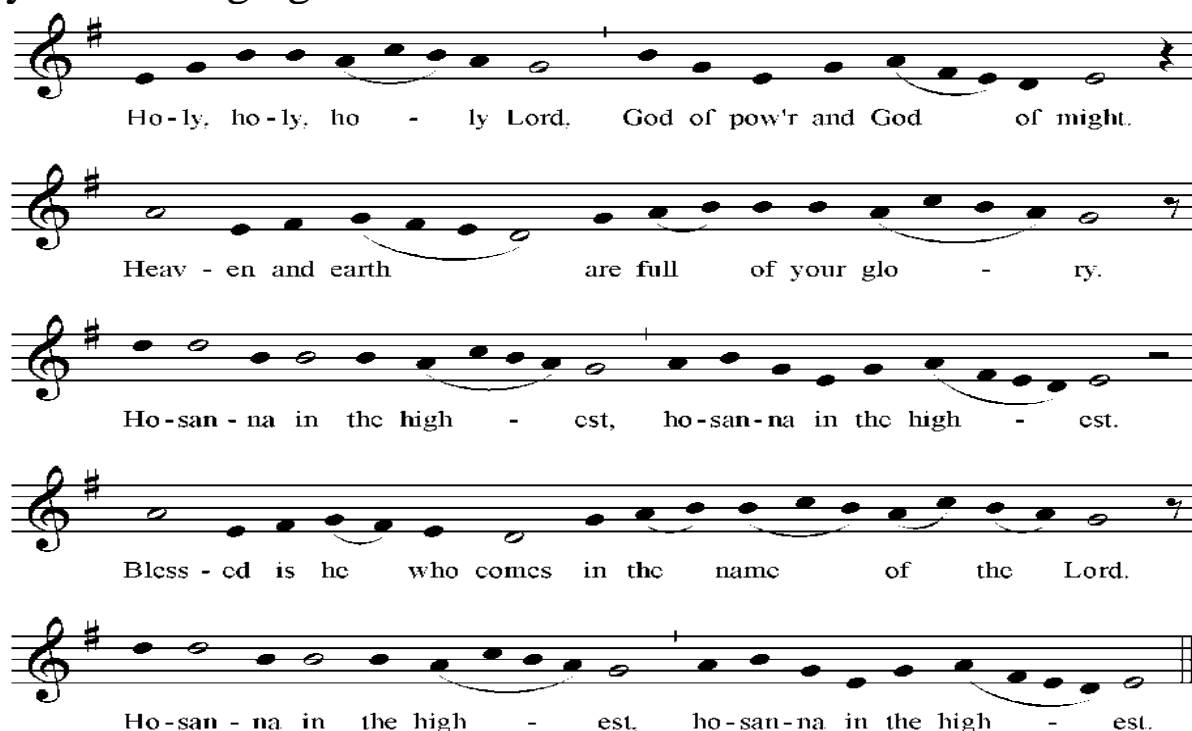

Therefore with angels and archangels and with all the company of heaven we proclaim your great and glorious name, for every praising you and singing:

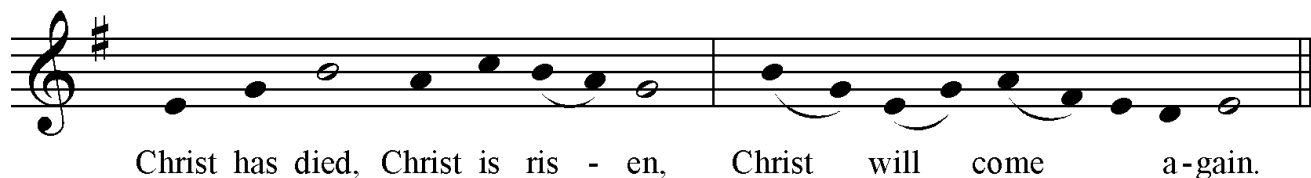

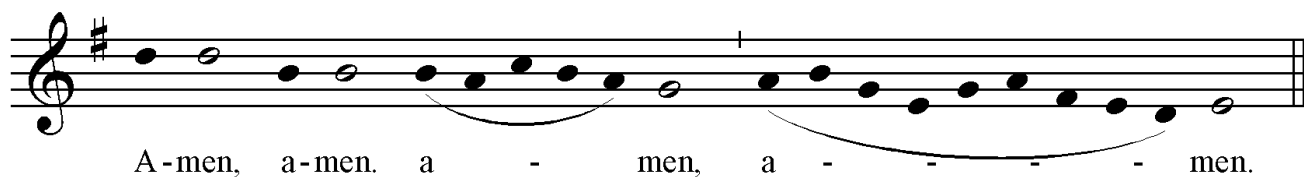


