CHRISTMAS TO EPIPHANY

Welcome to St Mary's North Melbourne for this celebration of the birth of Our Lord.

Christmas is the most joyous time of the Christian year, as we celebrate God coming to live amongst us in the form of Jesus Christ.

The date that Jesus was born is not known. However, St Luke's Gospel tells us that Jesus was born while Quirinius was Governor of Syria.

Christmas came to be celebrated by the Church on 25 December, the same day the pagan Romans celebrated the Winter Solstice, which symbolised the rebirth of the Sun. Since the fourth century, the Church has kept 25 December as the day to celebrate the birth of the Son of Righteousness – Jesus Christ.

Prior to the adoption of 25 December as the celebration of Christmas, Christians celebrated the birth of Jesus on 6 January – the day on which Epiphany is now observed. The word Epiphany means 'revelation' – for Christians in the Western Tradition, this is the day on which the Wise Men came to visit the infant Jesus. For many Christians in the Orthodox traditions, Christmas is celebrated on 7 January – the day after Epiphany.

The services of Christmas and Epiphany are enjoyed for the cheerful singing of well-loved Christmas hymns, known as carols.

We hope that, through inspirational worship and beautiful music, you may be brought closer to God, and that you may have a happy and joyous Christmas with your hearts full of love and peace.

The shepherds left their flocks to go to Bethlehem. Forgive our self-interest and lack of vision. We have sinned: Forgive and heal us.


The Wise Men followed the star to find Jesus the King. Forgive our reluctance to seek you. We have sinned: Forgive and heal us.

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered.

Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child.

And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger.' And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host,

praising God and saying, 'Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favours!'

This is the Gospel of Christ. **Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

THE SERMON

THE CREED

Let us declare our faith in God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We proclaim the Church's faith in Jesus Christ. **We believe and declare that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is both divine and human.** God, of the being of the Father, the only Son from before time began; human from the being of his mother, born in the world; **fully God and fully human; human in both mind and body.** As God he is equal to the Father, as human he is less than the Father. **Although he is both divine and human he is not two beings but one Christ.**

One, not by turning God into flesh, but by taking humanity into God;

truly one, not by mixing humanity with Godhead, but by being one person.

For as mind and body form one human being so the one Christ is both divine and human.

The Word became flesh and lived among us; we have seen his glory, the glory of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth.



EUCHARISTIC PRAYER





his one perfect and sufficient sacrifice for the sins of the whole world.


Renew us by your Holy Spirit, unite us in the body of your Son,

we worship you, Father, in songs of never-ending praise:




As our Saviour taught us, so we pray:
