




Let us therefore bring our sins before the one true God, in penitence and faith.

## SECOND READING

# A reading from the Epistle to the Hebrews:

This one became a priest with an oath because of the one who said to him, The Lord has sworn and will not change his mind, You are a priest forever. Accordingly Jesus has also become the guarantor of a better covenant. Furthermore, the former priests were many in number because they were prevented by death from continuing in office, but he holds his priesthood permanently because he continues forever. Consequently, he is able for all time to save those who approach God through him, since he always lives to make intercession for them. For it was fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, blameless, undefiled, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens. Unlike the other high priests, he has no need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins and then for those of the people; this he did once for all when he offered himself. For the law appoints as high priests humans, who are subject to weakness, but the word of the oath, which came later than the law, appoints a Son who has been made perfect forever. (Hebrews 7:21-28)

Immediately he regained his sight and followed him on the way. (Mark 10:46-52)






### THE LORD'S PRAYER
