Welcome to St Mary's North Melbourne for this celebration of the birth of Our Lord.



Lord of grace and truth, we confess our unworthiness to stand in your presence as your children. **Forgive and heal us.**


The Virgin Mary accepted your call to be the mother of Jesus. Forgive our disobedience to your will. **Forgive and heal us.**

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SECOND READING


A reading from the Letter to Titus:

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GOSPEL READING



The Lord be with you. And also with you.

A reading from the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overtake it. There was a man sent from God whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world came into being through him, yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave authority to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth.

SERMON

CREED

Please Stand

We believe in one God, the Father, the almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.


PRAYERS OF INTERCESSION




EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

Therefore we do as our Saviour has commanded ... : ... we worship you, Father, in songs of never-ending praise:




As our Saviour taught us, so we pray:

LAMB OF GOD




If you are baptised you are welcome to come forward and receive the Holy Sacrament. If not, you are welcome to come forward for a blessing.
