OUTLINE

The early church began the practice of the Vigil on the night before Easter Day, based on the Jewish calendar where the day begins at sunset. We light the Easter (Paschal) Candle from a charcoal fire, recalling the risen Christ's appearance to his disciples on the beach. We process into the darkened church, lighting our tapers from the Candle and listen to the good news of the resurrection from Scripture, prefigured in our Old Testament readings. We hear the story of the resurrection from Matthew which tells of two disciples, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary, the first to meet the risen Christ, believe the resurrection and respond joyfully to their commission. We renew our baptismal vows, and include the baptism of two babies. We celebrate the holy Eucharist, the great remembrance of Jesus' continuing presence with us, offering us hope with the promise of final peace and justice in a world torn apart by violence, injustice, suffering and death.

We gather outside the church to begin our celebration.

GREETING

Brothers and sisters in Christ, on this most holy night, in which our Lord Jesus Christ passed over from death to life, the Church invites its members throughout the world to gather in vigil and prayer. This is the Passover of the Lord when we share in his victory over death. We hear

the record of God's saving deeds in history, recalling how God's people were saved in ages past, and how God sent the Son to be our Redeemer. We pray that through this Easter celebration God's saving work may be fulfilled in us.

LIGHTING OF PASCHAL CANDLE

Eternal God, who made this most holy night to shine with the fire of your love, and bring us to the radiance of your heavenly glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The sign of the cross is made:

Christ yesterday and today, the beginning and the end, Alpha and Omega, all time belongs to him and all ages; to him be glory and power, through every age and forever. **Amen**.


The five wounds of Christ are marked:

We process into the church, following the Paschal Candle, and light our tapers. The light of Christ: **Thanks be to God.**

MINISTRY OF THE WORD

A reading from the Book of Genesis.

They heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden at the time of the evening breeze, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden. But the LORD God called to the man and said to him, Where are you? He said, I heard the sound of you in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked, and I hid myself. He said, Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree of which I commanded you not to eat? The man said, The woman whom you gave to be with me, she gave me fruit from the tree, and I ate. Then the LORD God said to the woman, What is this that you have done? The woman said, The serpent tricked me, and I ate. ... Then the LORD God said, See, the humans have become like one of us, knowing good and evil, and now they might reach out their hands and take also from the tree of life and eat and live forever—therefore the LORD God sent them forth from the garden of Eden, to till the ground from which they were taken. He drove out the humans, and at the east of the garden of Eden he placed the cherubim and a sword flaming and turning to guard the way to the tree of life.

Then the LORD said to Moses, Why do you cry out to me? Tell the Israelites to go forward. But you lift up your staff and stretch out your hand over the sea and divide it, that the Israelites may go into the sea on dry ground. Then I will harden the hearts of the Egyptians so that they will go in after them, and so I will gain glory for myself over Pharaoh and all his army, his chariots, and his chariot drivers. Then the Egyptians shall know that I am the LORD, when I have gained glory for myself over Pharaoh, his chariots, and his chariot drivers. The angel of God who was going before the Israelite army moved and went behind them, and the pillar of cloud moved from in front of them and took its place behind them. It came between the army of Egypt and the army of Israel. And so the cloud was there with the darkness, and it lit up the night; one did not come near the other all night. Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea. The LORD drove the sea back by a strong east wind all night and turned the sea into dry land, and the waters were divided. The Israelites went into the sea on dry ground, the waters forming a wall for them on their right and on their left. The Egyptians pursued and went into the sea after them, all of Pharaoh's horses, chariots, and chariot drivers. At the morning watch the LORD, in the pillar of fire and cloud, looked down on the Egyptian army and threw the Egyptian army into a panic. He clogged their chariot wheels so that they turned with difficulty. The Egyptians said, Let us flee from the Israelites, for the LORD is fighting for them against Egypt. (Exodus 14:15–25)

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans


Do you not know that all of us who were baptised into Christ Jesus were baptised into his death? Therefore we were buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we also might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like

his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, so we might no longer be enslaved to sin. For whoever has died is freed from sin. But if we died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. The death he died, he died to sin once for all, but the life he lives, he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

BAPTISM & RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL VOWS

As the clergy process to the font, the congregation is invited to gather around it.

We welcome those who come to renew their baptismal vows and those who come to be baptised. I invite their sponsors to present them now.

Sponsors: We present Jean to be baptised.

Sponsors: We present Noel to be baptised.

Will you accept the responsibilities placed upon you in bringing these children for baptism? I will.

Are you willing to answer on behalf of these children? I am. By your own prayers and example, by your friendship and love, will you encourage these children in the life and faith of the Christian

community? I will with God's help.

Praise and thanksgiving be to you ... the fountain of new birth.

The Paschal Candle is plunged into the font.

Send down upon the waters ... strength to the world.

The Paschal Candle is raised out of the water.

Through Jesus Christ our Lord ...world without end. Amen.

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him. Therefore I ask the sponsors of these children and all the baptised gathered here:

Do you turn to Christ? I turn to Christ.

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour? I repent of my sins.

Do you reject all selfish living, and all that is false and unjust?

I reject them all.

Do you reject Satan and all evil? I renounce all that is evil.

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?

I come to Christ.

Will you, by God's grace, strive to live as disciples of Christ, loving god with your whole heart, and your neighbour as yourself, until your life's end? I will, with God's help.

Almighty God, deliver you from the powers of darkness, and lead you in the light of Christ to his everlasting kingdom. **Amen**.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Brothers and sisters, I ask you all, with the sponsors of these children, to profess the faith of the Church.

Do you believe in God, the Father almighty?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in God's Son Jesus Christ?

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

This is the faith of the Church. This is our faith:

We believe in one God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Jean/Noel Constant, I baptise you in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen**.

Jean/Noel, I sign you with the sign of the cross to show that you are marked as Christ's own for ever.

God has brought you out of darkness into his marvellous light.

Shine as a light in the world to the glory of God the Father.

For both children:

God has called you into his Church:

We therefore receive and welcome you as members with us of the body of Christ, as children of the one heavenly Father and as inheritors of the kingdom of God.

RENEWAL

Almighty God, we thank you for our fellowship in the household of faith with all who have been baptised into your name. Keep us faithful to our baptism, and so make us ready for that day when the whole creation shall be made perfect in your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. **Amen.**


The congregation is sprinkled with water.
