



INTRODUCTION







FIRST READING


A reading from the Book of Proverbs:

SERMON

NICENE CREED

[Said at 8am, and today at 10am we sing the Creed]

We believe in one God, the Father, the almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

Please stand

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary and became truly human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.



- We all believe in God who made heaven and earth in all their splendour, who gave himself to us in love as our Father strong and tender. He provides for us and feeds us, every day his gifts surround us; keeps us safe from harm, and leads us, his protecting arm around us. He guards and keeps us day and night, all things are governed by his might.
- 2. And we believe in Jesus Christ, God's own Son, our Lord and Saviour, who rules with equal power and might at his Father's side for ever. He came down from heaven to save us, born of Mary by the Spirit. Through his human life he gave us life that we could never merit. He died upon the cross, and then was raised by God to life again.
- 3. And in the Spirit we believe, holy Comforter, life-giver, who with the Father and the Son is adored and praised for ever. He unites from every nation those to whom true faith is given; in the church, his new creation, wounds are healed and sins forgiven. The dead will all be raised, and we will live with God eternally.
