PLANNING AS GOOD STEWARDS OF PROPERTY

Last week I wrote about the desire of Parish Council to start some more intensive work on this issue. Here is a neat summary by Susan Brennan of where we are headed and how you, or someone you know, may be able to assist in this important part of God's work in this place in which we seek the involvement of the broader congregation.

Thank you to those who spoke to me after the Eucharist last Sunday to offer some of their skills – or express interest in being involved!

At its meeting on 27 July, Parish Council established a working group to progress planning for the redevelopment of the St Mary's land, including the Edith Head Hall site recently secured by the Diocese. The working group is presently comprised of the Wardens (Anne Sunderland, Helen McCallum, Adam Wing), the Treasurer (Andrew Barnard) and another member of Parish Council (Susan Brennan). The working group invites members of the congregation to express interest in joining the working group by advising Susan/Andrew/Fr Stuart.

In particular we are interested in parishioners with skills in property development, development finance, architecture/design, strategic planning and community consultation. The working group looks forward to consulting with the congregation about redevelopment opportunities in due course.

Might I add that it is never too late to be involved in the process as it will have many twists and turns (my experience teaches me) and if you have questions, do ask.

NEXT SUNDAY WE CELEBRATE OUR PATRONAL FESTIVAL

This coming week is the lead up to next weekend and our Patronal Feast.

If you are able to assist our loyal and creative band of caterers please speak to Marion or Susan.


This weekend gives us a chance to celebrate our life as a faith community and that its life is under the patronage of Mary, the Mother of the Lord.


A reading from the Book of Isaiah:

The vision concerning Judah and Jerusalem that Isaiah son of Amoz saw during the reigns of Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz and Hezekiah, kings of Judah. Hear the word of the Lord, you rulers of Sodom; listen to the instruction of our God, you people of Gomorrah! "The multitude of your sacrifices—what are they to me?" says the Lord. "I have more than enough of burnt offerings, of rams and the fat of fattened animals; I have no pleasure in the blood of bulls and lambs and goats. When you come to appear before me, who has asked this of you, this trampling of my courts? Stop bringing meaningless offerings! Your incense is detestable to me. New Moons, Sabbaths and convocations—I cannot bear your worthless assemblies. Your New Moon feasts and your appointed festivals I hate with all my being. They have become a burden to me; I am weary of bearing them. When you spread out your hands in prayer, I hide my eyes from you; even when you offer many prayers, I am not listening. Your hands are full of blood! Wash and make yourselves clean. Take your evil deeds out of my sight; stop doing wrong. Learn to do right; seek justice. Defend the oppressed. Take up the cause of the fatherless; plead the case of the widow. "Come now, let us settle the matter," says the Lord. "Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they are red as crimson, they shall be like wool. If you are willing and obedient, you will eat the good things of the land; but if you resist and rebel, you will be devoured by the sword." For the mouth of the Lord has spoken.

SECOND READING

A reading from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Hebrews:

Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see. This is what the ancients were commended for. By faith we understand that the universe was formed at God's command, so that what is seen was not made out of what was visible. By faith Abraham, when called to go to a place he would later receive as his inheritance, obeyed and went, even though he did not know where he was going. By faith he made his home in the promised land like a stranger in a foreign country; he lived in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. For he was looking forward to the city with foundations, whose architect and builder is God. And by faith even Sarah, who was past childbearing age, was enabled to bear children because she considered him faithful who had made the promise. And so from this one man, and he as good as dead, came descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sand on the seashore. All these people were still living by faith when they died. They did not receive the things promised; they only saw them and welcomed them from a distance, admitting that they were foreigners and strangers on earth. People who say such things show that they are looking for a country of their own. If they had been thinking of the country they had left, they would have had opportunity to return. Instead, they were longing for a better country—a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared a city for them.
